## What is the cost breakdown for a complete gas fireplace rough-in during Calgary new construction?

A complete gas fireplace rough-in during Calgary new construction typically costs \$1,200-\$2,500, covering the gas line, electrical rough-in, framing, and venting — significantly less expensive than retrofitting into an existing home.

The rough-in phase includes all the behind-the-walls infrastructure needed for your future fireplace installation. During new construction, this work is much more cost-effective because walls are open, access is unrestricted, and trades can coordinate efficiently without cutting into finished surfaces.

**Gas Line Rough-In (\$400-\$800):** Running a 1/2" or 3/4" black iron gas line from your meter or main distribution point to the fireplace location. The gas fitter will install the line with a shutoff valve and cap it for pressure testing. ## What is the cost of a fireplace heat exchanger replacement in a Calgary gas unit?

**Gas fireplace heat exchanger replacement in Calgary typically costs \$800-\$2,500 depending on the fireplace model, heat exchanger availability, and labor complexity.** However, heat exchanger replacement often isn't economically viable for older units, and a cracked heat exchanger usually indicates it's time to replace the entire fireplace.

## Is it cheaper to install a gas fireplace in a new Calgary home or add one during renovation?

**Electric fireplaces are the cheapest type to install in Calgary, with basic wall-mount units starting around \$1,500 installed.** Simple plug-in electric fireplaces require no gas lines, no venting, no chimney, and no permits — just mounting hardware and an existing electrical outlet.

If the gas fireplace was direct-vented through an exterior wall, you'll need to patch and finish the wall opening. The gas permit for disconnection typically costs \$100-\$150 through the City of Calgary, and a Safety Codes Officer must inspect the completed gas line capping to ensure it's properly sealed.

## **How much does annual gas fireplace maintenance cost in Calgary?**

**Annual gas fireplace maintenance in Calgary typically costs \$150-\$250**, with most homeowners paying around \$200 for a comprehensive service call from a qualified technician.

## **What's Included in Professional Maintenance**

A proper annual service includes cleaning the fireplace interior and glass, inspecting and testing the gas valve and connections for leaks, checking the venting system for blockages or damage, testing the ignition system and safety controls, and verifying proper combustion and flame patterns. The technician will also inspect the fireplace surround for proper clearances and check that carbon monoxide detectors are functioning. Many companies include a written report documenting the fireplace condition and any recommended repairs.

## **Why Calgary Fireplaces Need Annual Service**

Calgary's long heating season means your gas fireplace likely runs 4-6 months per year, accumulating significantly more operating hours than fireplaces in milder climates. Heavy use leads to faster accumulation of dust and debris in the combustion chamber, more wear on moving parts like gas valves and blowers, and greater stress on the venting system. Additionally, Calgary's extreme temperature swings and chinook winds can affect venting performance and cause expansion-contraction stress on gas connections that requires annual verification.

## **Cost Variables in the Calgary Market**

Basic maintenance on a standard direct-vent gas fireplace runs \$150-\$175, while premium units with complex controls, multiple burners, or integrated blower systems cost \$200-\$250 to service. If repairs are needed during the service call, expect additional charges: gas valve replacement (\$200-\$400), ignition system repair (\$150-\$300), or blower motor replacement (\$250-\$450). Some companies offer maintenance packages or multi-year contracts that reduce the per-visit cost.

## **Timing Your Annual Service**

Schedule maintenance in late summer or early fall before the heating season begins. October and November are peak months for fireplace service calls, so booking in August or September often means better availability and sometimes lower rates. Many Calgary homeowners combine their furnace and fireplace maintenance into a single fall service call, which some companies discount.

## **When to Call for Emergency Service**

Between annual services, call immediately if you smell gas near the fireplace, notice yellow or orange flames instead of blue, hear unusual noises during operation, or if the fireplace won't ignite properly. These symptoms can indicate gas leaks, blocked venting, or combustion problems that require immediate professional attention.

## **DIY Maintenance You Can Handle**

Homeowners can safely clean the glass doors when cool using appropriate fireplace glass cleaner, dust the exterior and mantel area, test carbon monoxide detectors monthly, and visually inspect the exterior vent termination for

obstructions like snow, leaves, or bird nests. However, never attempt to adjust gas components, clean internal parts, or modify venting systems yourself.
